Why: When their needs meet our offer

- French parliamentary lack knowledge as far as energy is concerned
- Their favourite fields are rather social and economical issues
- They are in search of prospective information from professionals, and want to go further than what they can find in the media.

What we have learnt about young politicians

- They are divided in many sections, and often have affinities with young people from other close parties.
- They have some energy and environment commissions (some know well the subject!)
- They are a proposition force for the elders: they have to write a young generation programme. So they are in search of prospective ideas.
- They like our commitment: « you are militants as well, you are committed into the society!

To join in ENC

- In order to have a special goal to meet our targets, to create an event, a deadline
- An original framework for our targets to talk about energy
- The topic : Europe and energy
 - A burning issue
 - To mix points of view and optimize exchanges



Preparation with young politicians

- Parti radical: mails (Debate with C. Ngô, meetings all along 2004)
- UDF: 18 October 05 (3 December 04)
- UMP : mails –(referendum European Constitution then internal meetings)
- PS: mails (referendum European Constitution then internal meetings)
- MRC: 11 October 05 (2 March 05)
- Greens: 6 October 05 (8 April 05)



Preparation with the students

3 phases :

Target : Polytechnique, Centrale Paris, Supélec, Les Mines de Paris, HEC, ESSEC, ESCP, Science Po, CELSA, ...

- 1. Spring 2005 : contacts with students associations. Few answers.
- 2. Fall 2005: second contact. Few answers.
- SFEN letter to 30 universities, followed by phoning.

Results:

- CFJ: 3 journalists students came thanks to our Green contact.

- Project sent in March
- Zagreb forum
- Core Meeting in Bristol


