**The Nuclear Institute are organising a one-day GDA Seminar on Wednesday 6 February 2013 at the QEII Conference Centre in Westminster, London. This event has the support of both DECC/ ONR and BIS and will not only address the current GDA process but also its future application to other nuclear systems, particularly the Hitachi ABWR design proposed for the Wylfa and Oldbury sites.**

As well as highlighting the process involved in carrying out the GDA, the technical issues arising, and the granting of a Design Acceptance Confirmation to the EPR design proposed for the Hinkley Point and Sizewell nuclear sites, the lessons learned will be examined. This event will also address the implications for UK companies arising as a result of Hitachi's plans to build ABWR reactors on the Wylfa and Oldbury nuclear sites, and the likely plans for GDA of the ABWR. This should give an indication when the substantial commercial opportunities are likely to be made available. This seminar will also include presentations from foreign regulators setting down their own safety assessment experiences, their views of GDA, and the advantages gained from regulators working together in multi-national forums.
